The Outdoor Education Program at YMCA Camp Potawotami uses the outdoors as a laboratory for learning and promoting a cooperative and ecological approach to education and life.

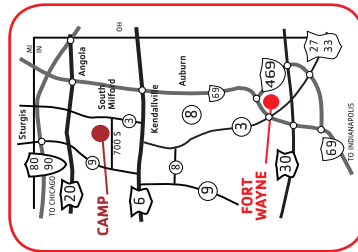
