Let's take a look at Summer 2023 by the numbers:

37 summer camp counselors served 735 campers. 12 of them were international staff!

Camp had 282 first time campers and 182 campers received financial assistance.

Campers visited the new High Ropes Couse 820 times and the waterfront3530 times. 662 campers said they made at least one new friend!

Percy Jackson camp kicked off for the first time in 2023, introducing a new program based on the book series by Rick Riordan for **16** campers.

From the Art Barn to Japan

After Jenny Herbe took the Art Barn to new heights in 1996, I got to lead the skills classes and free time activities there in 1997. We did everything from paper mache and tile painting to basket making and attempting to carve out a canoe from a fallen tree. I loved experimenting with not only the art but also the science of materials (gotta love humidity slowing down the plaster-drying process, defending your yarn from mice, or rain on your tie-dye t-shirts!)

One of my favorite crafts was making hand-made paper with wood pulp and then adding special ingredients like mulberries and flowers. I still experiment in this medium and recently took a trip to Japan where I was able to work with two different papermakers who apply traditional techniques in their studios. It was awesome seeing how some of the activities that we did at Camp have a long-standing global tradition, and how our creativity with the materials we had (and didn't have) in the Art Barn led us to some of the same innovations they are making on the other side of the world!

World Camp 1998

World Camp was an amazing experience, bringing together staff and adults from across the country and around the world for one week in August 1998! We spent over a year planning activities and sessions that helped staff to share their experiences at camp and develop new ideas, skills, and friendships! I got to lead a session in the Art Barn called "Camp Crafts on a Shoestring Budget" and we discussed ways to help other camps grow their art programs by connecting with donations and tying their projects into other areas of camp like nature study.

Where is Angie Now?

After living in Indiana, Pennsylvania, and Florida, I have finally settled down in Northwest Ohio and teach studio art, art history, and art technology at Wayne Trace Junior/Senior High School. I also work with the National Consortium for Teaching about Asia and consult with a number of museums to develop programs that help engage people with world cultures through art.

I am excited to serve on Camp's Alumni Committee and was thrilled to see my daughter become a staff member this year and to watch her develop some of the knowledge and skills that you can only learn at camp!
