

Everyone has fond memories at Arrowhead Lodge and our beloved historic Camp building is not going anywhere! In fact, it is getting some work done to protect and preserve for future generations! Arrowhead Lodge was built in 1931 and has served campers and guests every year since then. As many of you have seen, the foundation has developed cracks over the years.

In December 2023 the work began to secure the foundation, fill the cracks, pour new concrete and install gutters that drain away from the building. The work will be finished in the next couple of weeks. While you will not be able to see a huge difference once the work is complete, this work will help all campers and alumni enjoy Arrowhead Lodge long into our future.

During the April workday we plan to restore the upper porch by painting it and replacing missing rails. This summer we will add new chairs. This is the best place in all of Indiana to enjoy your morning coffee and we would love for you join us on the porch sometime this year!
